A PROCLAMATION TEEN DATING VIOLENCE **AWARENESS MONTH**

Domestic violence is a major public concern for our state and nation and is now WHEREAS:

> the single largest cause of injury to women. Females between the ages of 16 and 24 are more vulnerable to intimate partner violence than any other age

group, at a rate almost triple the national average; and

One in three adolescent girls in the United States is a victim of physical, WHEREAS:

emotional or verbal abuse from a dating partner, a figure that far exceeds

victimization rates for other types of violence affecting youth; and

High school students who experience physical violence in a dating relationship WHEREAS:

are more likely to use drugs and alcohol, are at greater risk of suicide, and are

much more likely to carry patterns of abuse into future relationships; and

Only 33 percent of teens who were in an abusive relationship ever told anyone WHEREAS:

about the abuse, and 81 percent of parents surveyed either believe teen dating

violence is not an issue or admit they do not know if it is one; and

By supporting young people with education about healthy relationships, and by WHEREAS:

changing attitudes that support violence, we recognize that dating violence can

be prevented; and

It is essential to raise public awareness about the frequency of domestic violence WHEREAS:

of all kinds and intervene before it escalates, so that the cycle can be broken

before it starts; now
