WHEREAS: It is important to encourage healthy, non-violent interactions and diminish aspects of society

that promote and support sexual violence; and

WHEREAS: It is important to broaden the scope and increase the effectiveness of sexual violence

prevention efforts through partnerships; and

WHEREAS: It is important to recognize the compassion and dedication of the individuals who provide

services to survivors and work to prevent sexual violence; and

WHEREAS: Every individual and community in Oregon has the ability to help eliminate sexual violence

by working together to promote social change.

THEREFORE: I, Theodore R. Kulongoski, Governor of the State of Oregon, hereby proclaim April 2010 to

SEXUAL ASSAULT AWARENESS MONTH
